Background

The sustainable management of natural resources and the strengthening of the agricultural sector could improve the quality of life of the most vulnerable populations and mitigate the effects of desertification and climate change.

Since its independence in 1948, the State of Israel has been confronted with ensuring the food security of a constantly and sharply growing population while facing harsh climate conditions and limited land and water availability. And yet, with more than 50% of its territory classified as a desert, Israel has succeeded in developing a flourishing agricultural sector renowned for its accomplishments and characterized by high productivity and technological innovation.

Within the framework of a national development policy, the various sectors have worked together to find solutions for the efficient use of scarce resources and to ensure high yield and quality food production. Farmers' commitment and their close collaboration with the research and extension institutions, together with a thriving industry, have driven the development of intensive and highly technified agricultural production, capable of responding to new challenges and the demands of both domestic and export markets.

Global changes such as climate or markets, require continuous adaptation and new strategies. Israel's agricultural policies aim to promote a dynamic rural sector, committed to the preservation of natural resources and the environment, encouraging entrepreneurship and development of new technologies, creating new sources of income and safeguarding the well-being of the rural community.

About the program

Aims

This training program aims to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of Israel's approach to agricultural development. It will explore the vision, policies, and practices that have transformed Israeli agriculture, while highlighting current innovations and strategies to address future challenges related to food security and climate change.

The program intends also to provide a platform for the exchange of knowledge and experiences among participants, enabling them to identify new opportunities and approaches that may strengthen their own action plans for the development of the agricultural sector in their respective countries.

Main Subjects

The program will include professional lectures and field visits on:

- The agricultural sector - Organization, policies & strategies
- Agricultural supporting systems
- Water and irrigation management
- Intensive production systems
- Precision and climate-smart agriculture
- Agricultural entrepreneurship
- Agriculture, environment & rural community

General Information

Arrival and Departure

Arrival date: 27th July, 2026
Official opening: 28th July, 2026
Closing date: 13th August, 2026
Departure date: 14th August, 2026

Early arrivals/late departures if required, must be fully coordinated in advance with the embassy of Israel. Participants will have to cover any additional costs that may be incurred from early/late arrival/departure.

Location and Accommodations

The training program will take place at - or near MATC - MASHAV's International Agricultural Training Center in Kibbutz Shefayim situated 20 km north of Tel Aviv and near the coastal city of Netanya. Participants will be accommodated in double rooms on a FB basis. (The specific hotel will be confirmed)

MASHAV awards a limited number of scholarships. The scholarship covers the cost of the training program including lectures and field visits, full board accommodation in double rooms, health insurance and transfers to and from the airport. Airfares and daily allowance are not included in the scholarship.

Application Requirements

The program is geared towards officials and professionals from governmental and non-governmental institutions, directly involved in agricultural development on a national, regional or local level. A full command of English is required.

General Health Services:

1. **MASHAV'S Medical declaration** must be completed and submitted together with the application form.
2. Participants will be covered by a medical insurance contracted by MASHAV. The medical insurance coverage applies only for the duration of the training, and does not include additional days, in cases of early arrivals or late departures.

MASHAV'S medical insurance covers only medical services and hospitalization in case of emergency. It does not cover the treatment of chronic or existing conditions, specific medications taken by the participant on a regular basis, dental care and eyeglasses. Participants will be responsible for all other expenses, which are not covered by the insurance policy. Israeli Health authorities recommend that all visitors to Israel make sure they **have been vaccinated against tetanus in the last ten years.**
